### Forward Festival: All the Buzz

The act of moving on, pushing forward, has a special significance these days. We do it because brighter days must be around that corner.

It's a principle on which the Forward Festival of electronic music and digital culture was founded. It's "the way that we try to live our lives . . . trying to be forward-thinking," says David Fogel, who hosts the Loda and X parties and who added this festival to his portfolio last year.

So today his smallish fest, which continues through Sunday, offers lessons from the cutting edge of digital

music: Learn to make bigger, badder fliers; to use digital painting technology to add a little color to the live show; even to incorporate an iPhone into live sets. (Fogel swears to us that he has seen a DJ banging out beats on the thing, using it to trigger his MIDI: "It's becoming the Swiss army knife of the new millennium," he tells us. Maybe, but we haven't managed to get ours to send picture texts.)

Workshops today are from 2 to 6 p.m. \$5. Space 88, 8211 Mayor Lane, Silver Spring.

Oh, yes, the parties -- they continue tonight at Gallery in Silver Spring with a (literally) buzzy set by video-game-sounding, dinosaur-suit-wearing Mochipet, California's Jeremy Ellis also holds court, and the lounge's alley reopens for the season with the revival of Baltimore's ambient Cloudwatch party with that 1990s event's original DJ LoveGrove. The key is in the mix. (\$10 before midnight; \$15 after. 9 p.m.-3 a.m.) Tomorrow, the music moves to the District, where two parties feature regulars Aligning Minds, along with international stars Dan Berkson and James What, at BeBar. And how will Forward, which was inspired by Montreal's Mutek festival, close? With a daytime party Sunday, of course, at Space 88, featuring DJs, barbecue, live graffiti and, what else? DJs.


